Original Corruption and Particular Sins: WCF 6:4


All particular sins come from this original corruption, by which we are –

Question 29: What are the punishments of sin in the world to come?

Answer: *The punishments of sin in the world to come are everlasting separation from the enjoyment of God in His presence, and extremely severe torments in soul and body, without any break, in the fire of hell for ever.*

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Sin in the Christian: WCF 6:5

This corruption of nature remains in those who have been reborn, during this life, and although it is pardoned and put to death through Christ, yet both itself and all its activities, are truly and properly sin.

The Larger Catechism

Question 25: What is the sinfulness of that state into which man fell?

Answer: *The sinfulness of the state into which man fell includes the guilt of Adam's first sin, the lack of the righteousness which he had at first, and the corruption of his nature, by which he is utterly indisposed, disabled and opposed to all spiritual good and is wholly inclined to all evil, and that all the time.*

This is commonly called Original Sin, and from it flow all actual sins.

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The First Sin WCF 6:1

When our first parents were deceived by the cleverness and temptation of Satan, they sinned by eating the forbidden fruit. God was pleased, in keeping with His wise and holy purpose, to allow this sin of theirs, having planned to order it for His own glory.

The Larger Catechism

Question 30: Does God leave all mankind to perish in the state of sin and misery?

Answer: *God does not leave all men to perish in the state of sin and misery into which they fell by breaking the first covenant, commonly called the covenant of works; but solely of His love and mercy delivers His elect out of it, and brings them into a state of salvation by the second covenant, commonly called the covenant of grace.*

The Need for a Covenant: WCF 7:1

He has been pleased to express this in the form of a covenant.

The Larger Catechism

Question 30: With whom was the covenant of grace made?

Answer: *The covenant of grace was made with Christ as the second Adam, and in Him all the elect as His seed.*

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The First Covenant: WCF 7:2

The first covenant made with humankind was a Covenant of Works, in which life was promised to Adam, and to his descendants in him, on condition of perfect and personal obedience.

[Gal 3:12, Rom 10:5; 5:12-20, Gen 2:17, Gal 3:10]

The Second Covenant: WCF 7:3

Since humankind by their fall had made themselves incapable of life by that covenant, it pleased the Lord to make a second, generally known as the Covenant of Grace. In it He freely offers to sinners life and salvation by Jesus Christ, requiring them to trust in Him that they may be saved, and promising His Holy Spirit to all whose who are appointed to life, to make them willing and able to believe.
