The Larger Catechism

BAPTISM (WCF 28)

Question 167: How is our Baptism to be used by us to good effect?

Answer: The necessary but much neglected duty of using our Baptism to good effect is an obligation throughout our lives, especially in temptation and when we are present at the administration of Baptism to others. Baptism is used to good effect by serious and thankful consideration of its nature, the purposes for which Christ instituted it, the privileges and benefits conferred and sealed by it, and our solemn vow made in it; by being humbled for our sinful defilement, for our falling short of and living contrary to the grace of Baptism and our pledges; by growing up to assurance of pardon of sin, and of all the other blessings sealed to us in Baptism; by drawing strength from the death and resurrection of Christ, into whom we are baptised, for the putting to death of sin and making alive in grace; and by making every effort to live by faith, to conduct ourselves in holiness and righteousness as those who in Baptism have enlisted in Christ's service, and to walk in brotherly love as being baptised by the same Spirit into one body.
